

Changing a MIDI file to an Audio File with the \$29.99 Version of QuickTime Pro

Open QuickTime

Go to **File/Import**

Next to “**Files of Type**” – Change to “**Audio Files**”

Find your folder and click once on the file you want to open so that it shows next to “**File Name**”

Click on the “**Convert**” button

Now you can save the file as a **.mid.mov** file that will open in QuickTime, or you can change the name as long as the **.mov** extension remains at the end of the file

Once it is saved, the file will open (**File/Open**) in QuickTime

To save it as an audio file (.aiff or .aif) go to **File/Export**

The window that opens shows the file with an .aif extension on the end. If not, make sure it says “**Music to Aiff**” next to “**Export**”. Once you have saved this file, you should have an audio file stored on your hard drive (or on removable media)

For programs that will change the .aif to another format (such as .wav or MP3) see the VT Fest handouts
